3.5 The Victorian Club Rally Series Committee

The Victoria Club Rally Series (VCRS) is run each year involving invited car clubs. The committee is made up of the representing clubs with a member from each club involved.

The VCRS Series Co-Ordinator and VCRS Series Regulations can provide more information.

4. Event Entry Authority

If the Competitor (the person entering the competition) is not also the registered owner of the vehicle, written authority from the registered owner authorising the use of the automobile in the competition must be presented at the Event Documentation. The Competitor must hold a Motorsport Australia Competition or Competitor's license, which must be presented at Event

Documentation.

Each driver must hold a civil driver license except for rally sprints that are conducted entirely on private property.

Individuals cannot interchange from their nominated roles whilst competing in special stages except in an emergency. Thus, a person entered as the driver in an event must drive the entered vehicle throughout the competitive sections.

5. Ambulance Cover

For all timed Road Events (Special Stage Rallies and Road Rallies), it is highly recommended that all crew members have a current ambulance membership or equivalent. Should they not, all crew members should be aware that they will be fully responsible for all costs of Ambulance services that are not covered by Motorsport Australia insurance.

6. Testing and Practice Days

Except for that conducted entirely on private property, all rally car testing and practice is to be conducted as a closed road, special stage event with a Motorsport Australia permit. For information on how to organise a Test or Practice Day, refer to the 'Testing and Practice Days' section in VRB Part B.

7. Crew Grading, Awards

7.1 Crew Grading

In all events, for prize money or awards, all crews other than Grade E/F crews will be graded as per the driver's grade unless specifically stated otherwise in series regulations or event supplementary regulations. For novice prize money or awards, a crew shall only be considered Grade E/F when both the Driver and Co-driver/navigator are Grade E/F competitors.

When a Grade C driver teams with a Grade A Co-Driver/Navigator, they will compete as a Grade C crew.

7.2 Eligibility for Awards

Unless specifically stated otherwise in series regulations or event supplementary regulations, eligibility for awards and placings for events, series, and championships shall be:

Outright	All crews
Grade B-	Crews with grade B, C, D, E or F Driver
Grade C-	Crews with grade C, D, E or F Driver
NOVICE-	Crews with grade E or F Driver & grade E or F Co-Driver/Navigator.

8. Supercharged/Turbocharged Vehicles & Novice Competitors

A driver in a rally or trial conducted in Victoria must **complete** 5 such events as a driver before they can compete in a vehicle with forced induction, unless dispensation is applied for and approved by the VRP.

The VRP would consider granting a dispensation to a driver who has completed eight VCAS autocrosses in the vehicle they wish to enter a rally or trial. The driver must compete at three different venues. Official results sheets to be tendered as evidence.

P plate drivers in Victoria are also restricted in the vehicle's they can drive.

A vehicle is probationary prohibited if it has:

- a power to mass ratio of greater than 130 kilowatts per tonne, or
- an engine that has been modified to increase performance (other than a modification made by the manufacturer during the vehicle's manufacture), or

- been declared as probationary prohibited in the Victorian Government Gazette. This applies to all vehicles, including those that have club permits.

Exemptions can be applied for through Vic Roads and the VRP.

A person who holds a probationary licence can drive a Probationary Prohibited Vehicle if a person who holds a full driver licence is sitting beside the probationary driver and is supervising the driver.

You may be eligible for an exemption if the probationary prohibited vehicle restriction would cause you undue hardship.

9. Competitor Officiating Requirement

Our sport relies heavily on volunteers, particularly to maintain 'Road Closed' conditions. Each crew member competing in an event of State Championship level or below must officiate at least once in the preceding 12 month period.

Officiating can be anything from Clerk of the Course to road closure. There is no stipulation as to what level it needs to be, save that the event must have been a calendared rally, trial or forest style road rally.

This requirement does not apply to Bitumen Touring Events (Road Rallies), nor does officiating on a Bitumen TRE qualify as a 'calendared rally or trial'.

Any competitors under 18 years of age will be exempt until they reach 18 years of age. The only further exemption to this is for interstate competitors.

If the competitor is a sitting member of one of the following committees or panels this requirement is also exempt. The VRP, the VCRSC, the VRCMG, the VRSP.

If you are new to the sport there is a 12 month period of grace. This is a once-only concession and there will be NO exceptions.

If the requirements have not been fulfilled, he/she will not be allowed to start the event.

If a competitor believes that he has an extraordinary circumstance, he may make application in writing prior to the event to the rostered event steward, whose decision will be final.

10. Scrutiny Matters

To facilitate scrutineering during an event the vehicle's Motorsport Australia log book is to be carried in the vehicle for the duration of the event.

New rally competitors are strongly encouraged to contact the Rally Scrutiny Group before starting to build or modify their cars, and before they finish their cars, for a free inspection. The Rally Scrutiny Group is more than willing to advise, guide, and inspect competitors' vehicles at any time during building or rebuilding. A contact list can be found as an appendix at the end of this document.

Correctly stamped homologation papers, or a Motorsport Australia recognised factory workshop manual must be available for presentation to the Scrutineers on request at pre event scrutiny and during the event.

10.1 Rally Car Vehicle Permits

1. Rally Permit Plates.

VicRoads have a Rally Permit (RP Plate) which is a twelve months Unregistered Vehicle

Permit. There are eligibility and usage restrictions. Your first step is to email the VRAP secretary on secretary@vicrally.com.au for information regarding this permit.

2. Unregistered Vehicle Permit for rally use.

VicRoads also have a short term (per event) UVP specifically for rally use. You can obtain a UVP for rally use by applying to Vic Roads directly. It is a requirement to display the permit in the lower left corner of the windshield for the duration of the event including all vehicle movements relating to that event.

10.2 Un-roadworthy stickers [“Canaries”]

No vehicle subject to an un-roadworthy notice will be scrutineered.

10.3 Vehicle Presentation

The Rally Panel via the Rally Scrutiny Group is continuing to tighten up on matters that have a bearing upon the image of the whole sport in the public eye. Competitors are reminded that vehicles judged by the scrutineers to have excessive body damage and/or dirty under body are not acceptable and may require re-scrutiny if deemed unacceptable before the event.

10.4 Passing Scrutiny

Competitors are reminded that before they are eligible to collect their route instructions and being permitted to compete in the event, they must produce the completed vehicle scrutiny sheet they received after the vehicle passes scrutiny by an MA certified scrutineer.

10.5 Fire Extinguishers

Each car shall be fitted with hand held extinguishers as per Schedule H of the Motorsport Australia Manual of Motorsport.

In a State Competition an Automobile manufactured after 1 January 2000³ must be equipped with a plumbed-in fire extinguisher system approved by the FIA.

10.6 Excel Rally Car Regulations

11. Observed Licence Test

An OLT is a prerequisite for a rally licence for those under 25. They can be conducted at Victorian Club Autocross series rounds and other special events. To obtain an OLT for Victorian rallying please contact secretary@vicrally.com.au for information. All OLT will be administered by the panel and all inquiries to be directed back to the panel.

Rally: An OLT is required if you are under 25 years of age. It is conducted by entering two Non-Speed or Speed events, with the PLA signed by the Clerk of the Course.

12. Noise

Noise regulations and testing of noise for all rally cars in Victoria will be as per the current Motorsport Australia National Rally Standing Regulations section 2.3. Anti-lag systems may only be used on competitive stages.

13. Conduct within Service Areas

Competitors are reminded of their safety obligations at service areas, in particular in areas where vehicles are refuelled. Under no circumstances are any naked flames or smoking to be permitted within 15m of any refuelling operation or fuel storage containers.

Service and/or competing crew members carrying out refuelling are also reminded to wear appropriate attire (e.g. neck to wrist to ankle) and to perform that function with the vehicle in a state where the risk of fire is minimised.

14. Scoring Equal Placegetters

Allocation of series points shall be as per the series or championship regulations.

15. Competitor Grading Criteria

Grades which are results based.

Each crew member in Victoria is awarded a grade, directly related to their results in recent events. A listing of competitor gradings is produced separately to this bulletin by the VRP Grading officer at the beginning of each year. As per the following tables. For queries on gradings, please contact Peter Otzen via pmaxotzen@hotmail.com. All grades can be amended at the discretion of the Victorian Rally Panel based on previous performances. Re-gradings during the year will be considered by the VRP on presentation of results as per the following tables.

Once a competitor attains **CLUBMAN** grade, they do not return to Novice grade

15.1.5 E – Novice

Any crew member who has been classed as a FINISHER in 5 VRP recognised events automatically goes from F grade to E (i.e. events that appear in the rally calendar).

Once a competitor attains a higher grade, they do not return to this grade.

15.1.6 F – Rookie

Any crew member who does not meet the requirement of a higher grade.

15.2 Grading Clarifications & Exceptions:

"Cross – Grading" of Competitors

Drivers

Any DRIVER graded as STATE CLASSIFIED, STATE RECOGNISED, RECOGNISED CLUBMAN or CLUBMAN is graded as a NOVICE Co-Driver/Navigator unless qualified for a higher Grading.

Co-Drivers

Any CO-DRIVER graded as STATE CLASSIFIED, STATE RECOGNISED, RECOGNISED CLUBMAN or CLUBMAN is graded as a NOVICE Navigator and NOVICE Driver unless qualified for a higher Grading

Navigators

Any NAVIGATOR graded as STATE CLASSIFIED, STATE RECOGNISED, RECOGNISED CLUBMAN or CLUBMAN is graded as a NOVICE Co-Driver and NOVICE Driver unless qualified for a higher Grading.

15.3 Eligibility for Events & Awards

Entry to “Novice” or “Introductory” events is restricted to Rookie, Novice, Clubman & Recognised Clubman drivers, however only Rookie and Novice competitors are eligible for awards. Eligibility for all other events should be determined by Series Rules / Regulations &/or event Supplementary Regulations.

Eligibility for “Novice” awards is restricted to crews comprised of Novice &/or Rookie competitors only.

15.4 Changes in Grade of Competitors

Unless by approval of an application to the VRP, competitors who qualify for regrading are not regraded until 1st January the following year; EXCEPT that ROOKIE competitors will be upgraded to NOVICE when they have achieved the appropriate qualification. The onus is on the competitor to demonstrate their qualification in this case (e.g. by production of results).
